France 102 min *subtitles RATING 14A*

Set deep in the heart of the French countryside, this film shows how everyone in a small village counts on the doctor, Jean-Pierre, who heals and reassures them day and night, 7 days a week. Now Jean-Pierre is sick, and yet he still fights to help others. Natalie is a young doctor who comes from the hospital to assist him. But will she adapt to this new life and be able to replace the man that is believed to be irreplaceable? This is old-school French cinema full of humanism and realistic characters.

Breathe

Andrew Garfield plays Robin Cavendish, a handsome and charming young man apparently living a blessed life, until, at 26, shortly after learning he is to become a father, he's struck down by polio. He is left paralyzed, unable even to breathe without the help of machines. *Breathe* is an inspiring true story about Robin and his wife who refuse to give up in the face of the disease. This is a heartwarming celebration of human possibility.

Strangers on the Earth

Perhaps Europe's most popular pilgrimage, the Camino de Santiago attracts wayfarers of all stripes to walk its ancient paths in search of meaning. One such pilgrim is Dane Johansen, an American cellist, who in 2014 ventured to walk the Camino with his instrument on his back, performing music for his fellow pilgrims along the way. During this documentary he finds unexpected and humbling insights into his own career and approach to life.

The Midwife

Catherine Frot plays Claire, a midwife in a maternity hospital, who is suddenly imposed upon by her deceased father's mistress (played by Catherine Deneuve), who needs a care aide. With dignity and sensitivity Claire does her best to handle this event in her life. Both actresses create a chemistry on screen and a relationship that is a perfect vehicle for themes of forgiveness, love and redemption.

The Other Side of Hope

Finland/Germany 100 min *RATING PG*

Mixing comedy with the drama of life, this story follows a refugee who finds support due to the good will of a restaurant owner in Helsinki who offers the refugee a job after finding him sleeping behind his restaurant. Aki Kaurismäki directed this movie with his trademark humane touch and is very clear about his politics of being an 'inclusive' European.
